Between working full time and assisting Al with COP activities and duties Helen still finds time to relax and enjoy doing her crafts and ceramics.

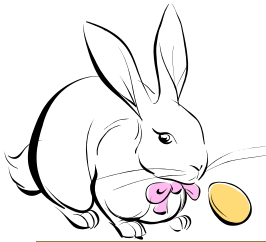
JUST A BIT OF TRIVIA

Deerfield Beach:
This district is Broward County's northernmost district and includes the City of Deerfield Beach. Bordered by the Atlantic Ocean to the east, the Florida Turnpike to the West, the Palm Beach

county line to the North and the City of Pompano Beach to the South and encompasses approximately 16.25 square miles.

The district has an annual operating budget of approximately \$17.1

million and provides for 162 positions including a district chief, four lieutenants, 14 sergeants, 110 deputies, 8 code officers and 6 volunteer parking enforcement officers.

UNIFORM GUIDELINES:

Just a reminder about uniforms:

All members will wear the designated uniform while on duty or attending official functions. *The uniform will not be worn in any other circumstance.*

The uniform will consist of the issued light blue shirt with Citizen Observer Patrol patch and American flag, Broward Sheriff’s Office issued dark blue

baseball cap with Citizen Observer Patrol logo or purchased blue COP visor, and dark blue slacks or skirt. Black/Blue belt or shirt squared off if worn outside the pants. Black/Blue shorts are acceptable. *Blue jeans and similar attire are not acceptable in uniform.*

Jackets with the prior sheriff’s name on them are not to be worn; you must purchase a new COP jacket if you want to wear it on patrol or during an event. No open-

toed shoes, high heels, or similar foot wear. If you have a medical problem and special shoes must be worn please advise Deputy Cathy Combs of your shoe change. Uniforms will be laundered, pressed, and maintained by the member.

Rules regarding the use of C.O.P. cars and C.O.P. clothing during a campaign or election, whether local or national.

1. When you go to the polls to vote DO NOT wear any clothing (jacket, hat, shirt, ID badge, etc.) that would identify you as a C.O.P.

member.

2. You may NOT drive your C.O.P. car to the polling place to vote or participate in campaigning.

3. A C.O.P. car may be parked in a C.O.P.’s residence driveway when exhibiting campaign signs on the lawn of the residence. Campaign material may not be on or in the vehicle.

4. No items of C.O.P. clothing may be worn to a political debate or campaign, whether it be local or national.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE SHERIFF’S DEPARTMENT DOES NOT GET INVOLVED IN CAMPAIGNING FOR ANY CANDIDATE AND WE ARE AN EXTENSION OF THE SHERIFF’S OFFICE.
